Consolidation of Ministry

The State EGF was formed in 1974 at Ranchi and Mr K. Israel became its first president. The next camp for students was organized with the help & interest of Ms Naomi Torkeson, a Lutheran Missionary, at Maharo.

Mr Sathkeerti Rao and Mr P.C. Verghese were the main teachers and lady staff was also active in it.

Early in the '80s Mr John Christian was appointed as a staff for Bihar. After that student and graduates groups were formed in Jamshedpur, Dhanbad, Sindri, Bokaro, Patna, and Raxaul.

Then came Mrs Parrot & Mr Devasahayam as staff for north Bihar and they consolidated the work initiated

by Mr John Christian.

Mr Surendra Kisku, an active member of the early Ranchi EU and then a lecturer in English at Ranchi and his wife Emily joined as staff in

1992, and in 1993 Mr Sanjay Kachhap, also an ex EU member joined as a staff for north



Bihar. Mr Julius, Ms Rose Desa Tudu, Mr Naman Topno worked as Co-ordinators during '90s, and UESI ministry developed in Bhagalpur, Dumka, Hazaribagh, and other places.

In 2001, Bihar was divided into 2 states as Bihar & Jharkhand. Ms Joanna Besra joined as UESI lady staff. Mrs & Mr Julius Panna were placed as staff worker in Patna in 2004. At present, 2 more staff there Mrs Anita & Mr Naman Topno are based in Muzhaffarpur and Mr Peromod is based in Bhagalpur, and one coordinator family is based in Patna.

Casteism is very strong in the state; Social discrimination has caused large scale extremist problems. Spread of the Gospel still is limited and Christian population is less than 2%. Missionaries are beaten, ostracized,



and thrown out in many places. People say it's a graveyard for mission. But there are several silver linings.

Present Bihar government is not hostile to Christians; people in remote areas are coming to Christ in large number. Students are interested to hear about Jesus.

So pray that the Lord may transform this 'Graveyard into a fruitful 'Vineyard.'

TRANSFORMATIONAL CHARACTERS AND CORRUPT ENTITIES

As per the new title, we'll try to peep through the lives of infamous people, too, mentioned in the Bible so we could take a caution and be turned on to do good.

We had started with the study of great leaders of the biblical days and touched on the life of Noah & his sons. Let us gaze at the Babel Tower and the ordeal that went into the construction and peep into forefathers' intentions as well. This will churn out interesting facts and instructions.

After the flood, the people who undertook the colossal construction had many advantages (I highlight only a few here. Otherwise, there were scores of advantages).

1. They had migrated from the East. Spreading abroad would have allowed them newer experiences & newer discoveries. Normally new expeditions open up new vistas of know-how. Also, the sons of Shem, Ham, & Japheth, after tarrying in the highlands of Armenia, would have come to the plain land. 2. They had 1 language, connecting easily. Often culture, traditions, & customs are similar among the people who speak the same language. 3. They found a plain area to settle down and build a massive tower. 4. The earliest mention of brick in history is found in Gen. 11.3. Probably brick was invented just before Babel Tower and the fresh invention was utilized in construction. 5. The next item is bitumen or asphalt. This is the first petroleum product ever used.

The list of advantages of these people goes on (Please study & identify the other advantages the builders had).

Why was God displeased with this project and foiled their attempt? Some verses help us to understand the key thinking of the builders. They said "Come, let us build ourselves a city and a tower with its top in the heavens and let us make a name for ourselves," Gen. 11: 4. The whole enterprise was of human independence and self-sufficiency apart from God. Their

technology and social unity gave confidence in themselves that they worked against God's plan of spreading across the world and to be a blessing. The Babel construction was only a beginning of what they could do. They would have taken up many more projects for pomp & self-glory. And as a result, they would not see the need of God in their lives.

God didn't send an earth quake or a volcano or a thunderbolt to destroy the tower. Rightly, He confused them by giving different languages to different people. As a result, they dispersed and the Tower project had to be abandoned.

From this instance, we learn that self glory and godlessness are the things that He hates. We were once godless and were working against God. But, God in His sovereign grace has chosen us and revealed His purposes to us. Let us pursue them.

Questions to ponder:

- ⇒ How often do we do things for self-glory depending on our own abilities and not on God?
- ⇒ How often does the temporal take precedence over the eternal in our lives?
- ⇒ What are the reasons for us to say (based on the passage) that God is interested in the welfare of human beings?
- ⇒ What principles do we need to follow to convert the advantages for fulfilling God's purposes?
- ⇒ What are the advantages in living in a linguistically homogenous community?
- ⇒ How can we transcend the language barriers to help others & present the Gospel to them?
- ⇒ Do we recognize the advantage of transcending language barriers by having God as the focus? If yes, what do we do?

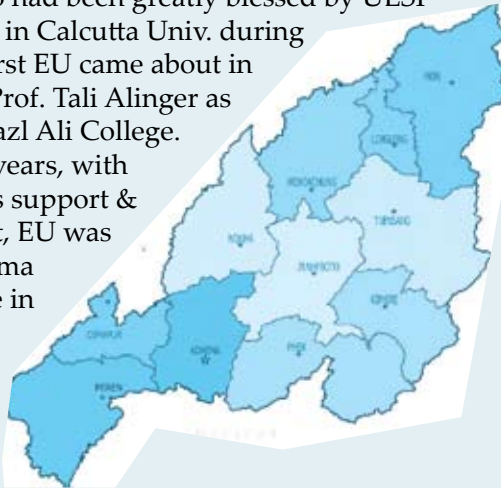

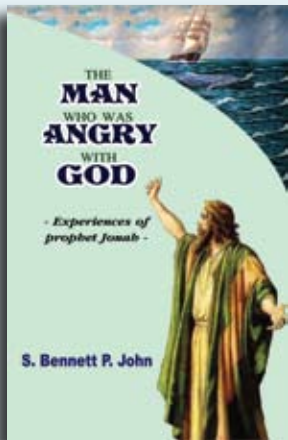

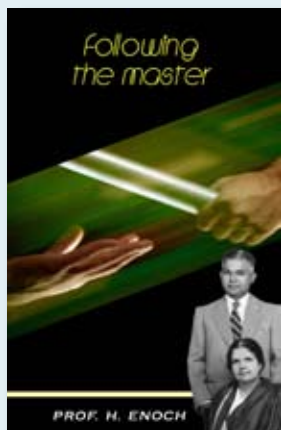
