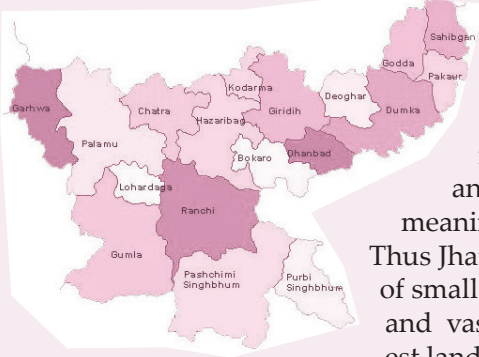

STATE FOCUS: JHARKHAND



The word Jharkhand comes from two Hindi words "JHAR" meaning jungle and "KHAND" meaning area/plot.

Thus Jharkhand is a land of small hills and valleys and vast stretch of forest land full of flora and fauna. It also has vast treasure

of minerals like iron ore, coal, mica, aluminum, and uranium to name a few.

History

The first missionary movement began with the three German missionaries sent by father Gossener to Ranchi in 1845. The UESI ministry in Bihar started in the early 1970s. Mr Prabhakaran & Mr K. Israel started UESI ministry in Jamshedpur and Mrs & Mr Choudhary started the ministry in Ranchi in 1972-1973. In 1973 Ranchi EU was formed and in 1974, the state EGF was formed. Camps were held in Ranchi and Dumka. In 1976, Ranchi ICEU was formed. Mr John Christian worked in Bihar as a staff worker in early 1980s. Later on, Mr Devasahayam came to North Bihar as staff worker in mid 1980s. The first local staff Mr Surendra Kisku & family joined in 1990 and later Mr Sanjay Kachchap. Student groups were formed in Jamshedpur, Ranchi, Patna, Bokaro, Raxaul, and Dhanbad.

Due to bifurcation of Bihar and Jharkhand in Nov. 2000, Jharkhand EGF emerged from Bihar EGF for the

development of the ministry in Jharkhand. It is indeed a stepping stone for the decentralization of Jharkhand in future. In this new academic year the State is divided into 7 regions.

The growing churches need qualitative spiritual leadership for which UESI has a vital role to play.



Impact in the Church - UESI has minimized the denominational differences among the church leaders and has brought unity among them.

Impact in the Society- A few EU students have gone for civil services and some have become secular and Christian writers, while some have started their own mission agencies.

Transformational Characters and Corrupt Entities - 2

The line of human history is dotted with many important milestones, revealing significant lessons. One such milestone is the building of the Tower of Babel. This is an important landmark for 2 reasons. 1. It showcases the strength of collective human effort. 2. It gave birth to umpteen languages and transformed people overnight that they were able to speak new languages. It is mind boggling! Let us gain insights from Gen. 11:1-4.

◎ *Unity in listening to one another & common language.* It is interesting to note here that 70+ patriarchs/ethnic leaders' names are mentioned. Their descendants must have been huge in number. But at one call – 'Come,' so many of those in Shinar were ready to help the project. There was unity in listening to one another.

◎ *Conservatives and avant-garde (modern & futuristic people) joined together:* When the suggestion came – 'Let us make bricks . . . the conservatives who would have preferred stones & mortar for construction, accepted the suggestion to use bricks & bitumen. They did a thorough job in preparing the bricks needed.

◎ *Vision for the city:* There seems to be a clear vision. Much earlier, Cain built a city called *Enoch*, Gen. 4:17. It would have been destroyed in the flood. Many cities like Nineveh, Sodom and Gomorrah were built even before Babel was attempted or at least in the contemporary times, Gen. 10. The experience gained in building them may have given ample advantage.

◎ *They organized themselves & the construction material as well:* Building a city & the tower needs lot of planning and management of human resource, perhaps based on skills and talents. Normally, a hierarchical structure of accountability is to be worked out for effective management of people. They seem to have got all these things done.

But the shortcomings were as given below:

◎ Making a name was the driving force and ultimate objective, which drove people towards a stupendous task. Some commentators say that Nimrod, a Cushite king was the man behind the whole project. The first centre of his kingdom was Babylon, a synonym of Babel, Gen. 10:10. Hence, there is a possibility that he was the source behind this project. Whoever might be the initiator, the driving desire was to gain a name for the whole race.

Let us pause here. How often *gaining name for ourselves & for the organization* becomes the sole factor to put in the best efforts? Should it not be the other way round where *bringing glory to God* should be the driving force?

◎ Religious undercurrents were other main factors: There were religious (false religious) motives behind this project. That is why the whole enterprise was detested by God. The ultimate motive was to plan for a religion where there is no place for true and living God. There are many references to Babylon in Revelation. One example is in Rev. 18: 2 - And he cried out with a mighty voice, saying, *Fallen, fallen is BABYLON THE GREAT! She has become a dwelling place of demons and a prison of every unclean spirit, and a prison of every unclean and hateful bird.* This gives us a glimpse of what Babel or Babylon was like when it was built.

The word Babylon comes from the word *bāb-ili* meaning "gate of God" and on the Hebrew words *Bā bhel* (Babylon) and *bā lāl* mean 'to confuse'. These root words give us an idea of what the intention of the people of Babel was and also the thing that happened in Babel with God's intervention.

Important lessons can be derived from how God dealt with the whole enterprise. They will appear in the next article. Please do follow the sequence.

STATE FOCUS: MIZORAM

From a wild darkness of animism and barbaric lifestyle to a life of peace and tranquility, it took less than 100 years for Mizoram to become a Christian state. For more than 30 years, the UESI ministry in Mizoram has been touching many lives and has been instrumental in directing the state's religious, socio economic & political steps.

The Origin

The idea of student evangelical movement in India during the 1970s inspired people like Dr R.K Nghakliana, a successful evangelist, to form state Evangelical Graduates Fellowship. After much prayer and deliberation it led to the formation of the Mizoram EGF on Saturday, 22 Nov. '75, with Dr Tluanga as President, Mr Chhawnvunga as Secretary, Mr S.H. Pautu as Treasurer, and Dr C. Rawna as Prayer Secretary.

These early leaders were directly involved in college education by their profession. The MEGF members then went on to engage themselves in their weekly prayer meetings. The Fellowship had more members like Dr H Lallungmuana, Pu Vanhela Pachuau, Dr Lalruanga, Dr Sangluaia Sailo, Pu Saptawna, Mr Sam Joseph, among others as time passed by.

20 years later, the Aizawl ICEU was formed on 22 July '95 by the leading colleges in Aizawl. Today under AICEU, there are 11 units which serve the Lord faithfully.

The Present Order

With a sense of gratitude and challenge, Mizoram EGF commemorated its 30 years of enduring ministry in 2006, with a small number. Today, the membership has grown tremendously, primarily due to the involvement of former EUs in colleges.

In a significant move, EGF set up a Prayer Cell group in Mizoram University campus in Oct. '08. The members organize prayer meeting and Bible study Friday evenings.

Ministry

MEGF guides EUs in their activities. It provides EUs with resource persons for their programmes and meetings. It also supports the EUs through finance and involvement. The EGF members are perhaps

most helpful when Discipleship Training Camps for EUs are held every year. Besides backing up EUs, the MEGF also holds regular Bible Study session every first Saturday morning at 7 o' clock. For quite some time now, the UESI work in Mizoram has been strengthened to embark on certain programmes in the North East as



well as at the state level that used to be impossible.

From last year MEGF started a monthly news bulletin, MEGF LINK. There is a strong feeling among the members to mobilize those who were involved earlier in UESI ministry and those currently involved through MEGF and EU ministry. In Aug. '09 a DTC Reunion was organized successfully.

The Challenges

There is no open adversity to Christian faith as the state is already a home to many para-church organizations. However, there is skepticism to any inter-denominational work including the UESI. Currently, the membership in UESI is also in a relatively small figure, sometimes, inadequate to put up an event. The ministry is concentrated in the capital city, Aizawl. It is time the ministry branches out to the entire length and breadth of Mizoram.

Modernization and the issues that youth face are increasingly complicated. UESI has a unique task to reach out to this generation and help them face these problems.

UESI is now a gradually-growing phenomenon. As we see the future state leaders in their student days, it is our dream and prayer that they will capture the entire state for the Lord Jesus Christ through their work in the educational institutions. You may join hands with us in this noble endeavor.

STATE FOCUS: MEGHALAYA

Meghalaya means “the abode of clouds”. It received its full statehood on 21st Jan, 1972. It stretches over an area of 22,429 sq kms and has a population of over 23,18,822. Shillong, its state capital, is known as “the Scotland of the East.” Christians are the majority with 79.8 %.

There are 5.9 % Hindus, 0.7 % Muslims, 0.1 % Buddhists. Quite a large number of people (6,324 persons) don't mention their faith. The state comprises of 7 districts - Jaintia Hills, East Khasi Hills, West Khasi Hills, Ri Bhoi, West Garo Hills, East Garo Hills & South Garo Hills.

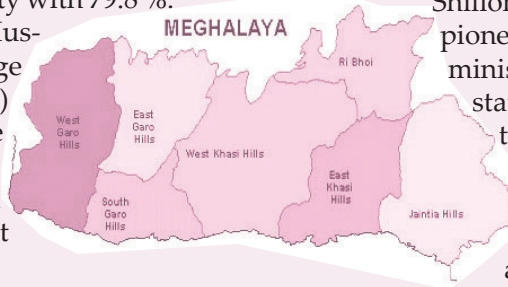
Shillong is the educational hub of the North East. Students from all over the North East and other parts of India come to Shillong to continue their studies in class 12th or Bachelor Degree or Master Degree. Apart from the conventional streams of education, there are also others prestigious institutions like Shillong IIM, NIFT,

ICFAI, ICFI and many others, providing professional courses. There are 84 colleges affiliated to North Eastern Hill University (NEHU).

Meghalaya also witnessed the birth of UESI-NE in Shillong way back in 1959 through the pioneering work of Dr John Moody. The ministry then spread to other parts of the state and in the year 1967, the ministry found its place in the Garo Hills through the pioneering work of Mr Roderick D Shira and Late Mr Hubert D Areng. The ministry also spread to Jowai, Nongstoin, Mairang, Williamnagar, Mawkyrwat. In December 2009, Shillong hosted the UESI-NE Golden Jubilee celebrations.

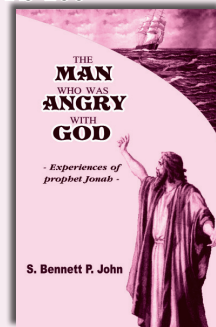

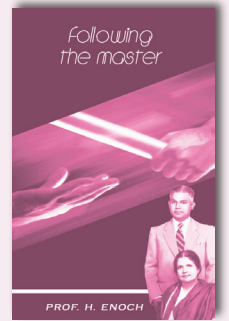
